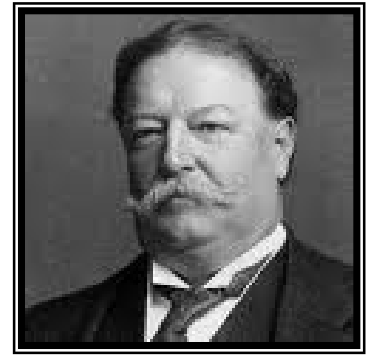
5 or 6 lbs. beef roast	5 tbsp. pickling spice	½ tsp. cumin
1 lg. onion , chopped	6 cans tomato sauce	3 bay leaf
2 lg. garlic buds, chopped	1 tbsp. white vinegar	6 whole allspice
3 loaves hard french bread	salt & pepper to taste	



Put roast in large roaster. Add diced onion and garlic, bay leaves, sprinkle black pepper and cumin over all the roast. Add pickling spices, whole allspice, tomato sauce and salt to taste. Add vinegar. Mix with hand. Add enough water to cover meat about 3 to 4 inches above meat. Put in 350 degrees for 2 hours or more until meat is tender. Taste. Put mint on top of each slice of bread. Put sauce on top, double or triple if desired.

Americanization

In 2010, our Americanization program was busy with several projects. Betty Mekus, sister of George Perry, once again did a wonderful job helping Veteran groups all year. She participates by visiting Veteran Hospitals, working with the V.F.W. at their functions, helping at the 4th of July celebration and Red Poppy Days. Betty shows us every year what a great patriot she is. Member Cass Sylvia, Yolo County Public Guardian, presented a Memorial Day tribute to Veterans who had served and are now deceased at the internment monument at the Knights Landing cemetery. We have also provided gift packages to Mather Field Veterans, and San Francisco Veterans hospitals thanks to the dedicated work of Darlene De Anda former Americanization chair.

Our other project for 2010 was sending gift packages to active military in Iraq and Afghanistan. We sent to the 115 members of Battle Company of U.S. Army, deployed in Iraq. We provided them summer and Christmas packages in 2009 and Valentine goodies in 2010. We received donations from club members and community members of both goodies and money for these shipments. When Battle Company returned home, we adopted the National Guard 330th Military Police Company, 3rd platoon. These 12 young men are deployed to train Afghanistan police officers. One of them, A.J. Whipple, is the grandson of our member Paula Cooper. We sent this platoon shipments for Halloween and Christmas. Each soldier received comics, books, dental supplies, toiletries, snacks and hand warmers. We want to thank the many dentists that donated items and to our citizens and club members. We are so grateful to our community for becoming involved with our Americanization causes.

Now that 2011 has arrived, we want to thank Mariesa Nyman for her work as chair in 2010. This year, as the new Americanization chair, I will be pursuing those same projects and hoping others will come forward with ideas for new projects. We need help to support and remember the work our veterans have done and that our active military still provide. I look forward to working with everyone and hope to hear from you for ideas on what Americanization projects we can undertake for 2011.
