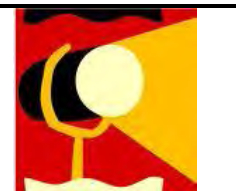




Cabrillo Club #26

LINGUICA HORS D'OEUVRES

1 cup sliced or diced linguica,
1 tbsp. onion , chopped
1 cup American cheese, grated

2 1/4 cups bisquick
2 tbsp. chopped parsley
1/2 to 3/4 cup milk



Cook linguica; cut up or sliced thin. Drain off excess fat. Mix linguica with bisquick, parsley, onion and cheese. Add milk until dough holds together. Shape into small balls of even size. Bake in a 375 degree oven about 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned. Can be made ahead, frozen and then reheated.


